I agree, as a condition of being allowed to use the ski area facility and premises, that I freely accept and voluntarily assume all risks of personal injury or death or property damage, and release the Hartland Elementary School and Woodstock Resort Corporation d/b/a/ Suicide Six Ski Area and its agents, employees, volunteers, directors, officers, and shareholders from any and all liability for personal injury and property damage which results in any way from negligence, conditions on or about the premises and facilities, the operations of the ski area including, but not limited to, grooming, snow making, ski lift operations, actions or omissions of employees or agents of the area, or my participation in skiing, snowboarding or other activities at the area, accepting myself the full responsibility for any and all such damage or injury of any kind which may result.

Responsibility Code

Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in skiing and snowboarding that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a great experience.

1. Stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. When entering a trail or starting downhill, yield to others.
5. Always use devices to prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.
If you need help in loading or unloading, please ask for assistance.

This year’s program will take place again at Suicide Six in Woodstock. The program is open to all currently enrolled Hartland Elementary School students. The program will consist of six days of skiing on the following Tuesdays:

**January 10
January 17
January 24**

**January 31
February 7
February 14**

In case of a severe weather cancellation, we will make every attempt to host a “make-up day”, but if this is not possible, no money will be refunded. The program offers a one-hour lesson from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. with Suicide Six instructors. Lessons are strongly recommended. Chaperone volunteers will provide subsequent lessons as needed. **PLEASE NOTE: It is highly recommended that a snowboard student has at least one year of ski lessons prior to snowboarding. Ski experience dramatically increases the initial snowboarding learning curve.**

Please find enclosed both information about the program and the necessary forms to fill out (one per participant). The cost for the six weeks of skiing/snowboarding and six hours of instruction is \$150.00 per child. If your child has a Suicide Six Season Pass, the cost for the six weeks of lessons is \$90.00. The cost for lift tickets for six weeks (no lessons) is \$60.00 per child. The program does not provide rental equipment. Please make sure your child is equipped with properly fitting gear. **All participants MUST wear a helmet.**

Any adult who has completed the Release From Liability Form may volunteer as a chaperone. A Chaperone lift ticket may be purchased at the mountain that day for \$10. Chaperones are welcome to ski all day. Kindergarten and pre-school students are not eligible for lessons but are welcome to purchase a \$10 lift ticket as long as they have a parent or chaperone with them.

- All forms and payment should be put in the collection box in the H. E. S. office by the deadline of **Thursday, December 15. No applications will be accepted without payment.** Please make checks payable to Suicide Six Ski Area and please note your student(s) name(s) on your check.
- A skiing parent must accompany students not yet in first grade or any other child unable to ride a lift alone in order for them to participate.

Forms:

REGULATIONS

The following regulations were developed in order to foster an atmosphere of safety, fun and learning for the program and to ensure each student's enjoyment of this unique opportunity.

The following rules will be in effect:

1. All students are expected to arrive **on time** for lessons.
2. Lessons are the heart of the program and are strongly recommended. Students are encouraged to attend all lessons for safety & learning.
3. Students are expected to be respectful of the instructors, staff at Suicide Six and program chaperones.
4. Students are expected to adhere to with the Skier's Responsibility Code and with Suicide Six Regulations.
5. Students may not leave the ski area without either checking in or being signed out by program organizers.
6. Students are encouraged to ski/snowboard only on trails suitable to their ability levels. These include trails they have comfortably navigated during lessons or in a supervised situation. If a student is unsure, they should ask a chaperone for permission and/or to accompany them. Program organizers are responsible for the restriction of students to terrain that they feel is appropriate and safe.

Please review these regulations carefully with your children. Because following these rules is essential to the success of the program and the ability of other participants to learn, ski/ride and travel safely, and to fully benefit from and enjoy the program, the following consequences will be enforced:

1st Offense

- * Lift ticket pulled immediately.
- * Notification of program director.
- * Probationary status in program.

2nd Offense

- * Expulsion from program.
(Program fees will not be refunded)

Naturally, the seriousness of the offense will be carefully weighed when enforcing these penalties.

GENERAL INFORMATION

We recommend that students have equipment and clothing from the list below. Please advise organizers of any problems this presents and we will attempt to assist you.

RECOMMENDED CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT LIST

Equipment

Must be safe and fit well. If you are unsure of any aspect of your equipment, please have it checked by a reputable ski shop. Young first year skiers will not need poles. Plastic snowboards purchased at stores such as K-Mart and Wal-Mart provide great fun in a backyard setting but are not appropriate or safe on groomed slopes. Please ensure that snowboards have edges and proper bindings. **ALL EQUIPMENT SHOULD BE CLEARLY LABELED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME (duct tape and a Sharpie work great!).**

Clothing

The following items are recommended for anyone participating in the Program:

- * warm, water resistant jacket and pants or one piece suit
- * warm, dry winter socks
- * waterproof mittens or gloves (knitted mittens will not keep hands warm and will get wet)
- * **ALL CLOTHING SHOULD BE CLEARLY LABELED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.**

The following items are highly recommended for comfort and warmth:

- * goggles
- * long underwear
- * neck warmer/gaiter
- * extra dry socks
- * sunscreen
- * binders to keep skis together if you own your equipment

HELMETS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS.

NO SCARVES OR LONG HATS, PLEASE!

CHAPERONE INFORMATION

General Information

Please read the Program Regulations and familiarize yourself with them. We are committed to having the program run smoothly and to attending to any problems quickly. If you have any questions about the regulations or feel that there has been a case of questionable behavior, please discuss it with a school ski committee member immediately.

All skiing/snowboarding chaperones will purchase a lift ticket for the day from the mountain for \$10. Chaperones are allowed to arrive at the mountain before their program is scheduled to begin so that they can do some skiing or riding.

Chaperone Schedule

- 1. Arrive at mountain.** Check-in, get lift ticket and move to changing area.
- 2. If there are enough chaperones** there, please do one or all of the following:
 - Help kids in lodge get into gear. Check for ski pants, hats or headbands and gloves. Ski pants and gloves or mittens are mandatory regardless of temperature. Also check boots--are they buckled properly, on correct feet, etc.
 - Tell kids to go to assigned meeting place. Have them look for the chaperone assigned to their group. The first week we will all gather in one spot.
 - Most chaperones will be assigned to a group. Chaperones ski/snowboard with assigned group unless instructor tells them otherwise. Please carry a pencil and paper and keep track of who is in your group. Also note any concerns re: ability, behavior, etc. If you think a child is in the wrong group, discuss it with the instructor if you can and also let your Program Coordinator know. The role of a chaperone can sometimes be tricky. Please make sure that you jump in if the instructor needs help. If you are in doubt, stand back a bit. Instructors appreciate your help but also need to be able to "do their own thing". This applies particularly to the beginners. Although it is sometimes hard to watch a child struggle to get up or stay balanced, please resist the temptation to help too much--this is all part of the learning process. If you are unsure, ask the instructor for guidance.
 - After lessons, ski/snowboard where you are assigned or think you are needed – please be sure that you are skiing/snowboarding with a group of kids. These can be your own, or just join a group. Try to ride up the lift with kids. Please keep in mind that the beginner areas are where the majority of students need help, or at least an adult, on the lift. Please put in your time in these areas during the course of the program. We also need people on the main mountain to ensure that skiers/snowboarders are on appropriate trails, skiing/riding safely, etc.
 - Parents or assigned chaperones of Kindergartners and 1st graders should be with them at all times!
- 3. At an assigned time,** all kids should be heading in, gathering gear, placing equipment in the pick-up area. Please help them move along.

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SPECIAL NOTES

BEHAVIOR & SAFETY

PLEASE REPORT ANY QUESTIONABLE BEHAVIOR TO THE PROGRAM COORDINATOR.

Safety is our key concern. Students need to be skiing on trails that match their ability and at reasonable speeds. They need to ride lifts responsibly and treat other skiers with respect...while having fun too! If you come across a student who is clearly on terrain that is too difficult, please escort them down the slope if possible by skiing/riding with them. If this is not possible, have the next person that comes down the trail contact Ski Patrol and ask them to assist. Please discuss appropriate terrain with the student and be sure they are clear about where they should be skiing/riding.

ACCIDENTS

If you should come across an accident, do not make any attempt to do anything other than get help. If you are with other kids, stay with the victim and send a kid or kids down to the bottom lift attendant or to the office in the Lodge to call Ski Patrol. You can try to make the person warm by giving them your jacket.

DO NOT REMOVE ANY EQUIPMENT OR INTERFERE IN ANY WAY.

You should remove your own skis and place them, upright in the snow at least 10 feet above the person in an "X".

Please be sure they are secure in the snow. The Ski Patrol will ask you for a report in most cases. Please also advise one of our ski committee and make a few notes about the event. If it is one of our kids, please stay with them until they reach first aid.
